21 Aug 1734	Anne Russell of Prince George Co. received a patent for 203 acres of new land in said county on the branches of the lower or south side of Knibbs Creek in the Poyson fields adjoining Mr. Edward Booker.[1] This land appears to have been located in the portion of Amelia County that was formed from Prince George.[2]
Bef 1736	William Russell and Ann Russell were imported into Virginia by Edward Booker, who was granted a patent 23 July 1750 for 475 acres in Lunenburg Co. (formed 1746 from Brunswick Co. (Deed Book 29:252, in Russell Register 20(4):2684. NOTE: This could be William & Ann Russell of Halifax Co., VA, or it could be William Russell & his mother, Ann, of Amelia Co. (and Prince Georges Co. earlier). It also could be an unidentified William & Ann Russell.
1736	Amelia Co., VA. William Russell, 1 poll between Deep and Flat Creeks. [3]
1737	Amelia Co., VA. William Russell, 1 poll between Deep and Flat Creeks. [4]
12 Aug 1737	Amelia Co., VA. Anne Russell, William Russell, Hannah Rudd, Elizabeth Story, and John Story made oath they had no allowance for persons imported to the colony of Virginia. It is thereupon considered by the Court and accordingly ordered that the same be certified. Hannah Rudd was the mother of Jane Rudd, who married Simcock Cannon, and who had a son, Russell Cannon). Hannah Rudd was the wife of John Rudd Jr. and appears to have been nee Russell. [5] [The 1771 will of Hannah Rudd in Chesterfield County names nephew Edward Storey]. [6, 7]

15 Jan 1741	Amelia Co. John Bentley petitioned to keep the courthouse clean & to have the same allowance as Ann Russell, dec'd, lately had.[11] [Ann Russell appears to have been the mother William Russell. He sold her land in 1744 (see below).
1744	Amelia Co., VA. William Russell, 1 poll between Deep and Flat Creeks. [12]
18 May 1744	Amelia Co., VA. William Ferguson vs. William Russell, to Ptf for 3 pounds & costs. Note that Moses Farguson's estate in Chesterfield Co.[13] was appraised by Thomas Rudd & John Russell, among others. Moses may have been kin to William Ferguson. [14]
19 May 1744	Amelia Co., VA. William Kennon vs. John Willson for 10 pounds. Jury sworn: Henry Isbell, William Russell, Henry Farley, Thomas Leonard, John Bentley, James Collins, Thomas Lorton, Stephen Neale, William Green, John Hampton, Roger Neal & Samuel Pincham. Found for plaintiff £6.13.8 & costs. (Samuel Pincham married Jane Cannon, daughter of John Cannon Jr. & Mary Price.) [15]
bef Jul 1744	William Russell & Mary, widow of a Mr. Cannon, were married. Mary Cannon had a son named James Cannon. She had a son with William Cannon named James Russell.[16] It would

1746	Amelia Co., VA. William Russel, 1, taken by Thomas Tabb, betw. Flatt Creek & Appomattox River. [23]
12 Jan 1746/7	Amelia Co., VA. William Cannon received a patent for 70 acres of land on the lower side of Flatt Creek adjoining Elam and Robert Vaughan. [24] This land apparently adjoins 203 acres that William Russell received by patent on 12 July 1750. [25]
abt 1747	Amelia Co., VA. Son Joseph was born to William Russell Sr. and Mary.

Wit: Ezekiel Slaughter, James Daniel, Thomas Lacy, Jr. Signed by mark "X." Mary, wife of sd Russell relinquished her right of dower.[51] [NOTE: I could find only 195 acres bought in 1751 and 400 bought in 1759.]
02 May 1761	Lunenburg Co., VA. John Morton and wife Amey of Halifax Co. conveyed to William Russel of Amelia County, for £10, 990-acre tract on the head branches of the Little Roanoke, adjoining Bartlett Anderson [etc., bounds given]. Wit: Joseph Morton, Thomas Wren, James Heeth (Heath). [52]
27 Sep 1762	Amelia Co., VA. above map. However, the lands of William Kennon of Henrico were over 10 miles from the land of William Cannon that adjoined William Russell as discussed below. Little has come to light to date regarding the relationship of William Russell to Mary Cannon and William Cannon per the 15 November 1745 record in which William Cannon, an orphan, chose Mary Cannon as his guardian with William Russell acting as security.<sup>196</sup> However, as noted above, William Russell appears to have patented land in 1750 that adjoined William Cannon's 1746/7 patent land of 70 acres.

## Hatchett Documents - Notes of William R. Hatchett

The following is contained in the diary of John Hatchett, immediately following the last entry of John Hatchett's writing. It was written by William Russell Hatchett, the son and only child of John Hatchett. The text below is a literal translation of the text, with my notes in square brackets. The square brackets and what is within them is not in the actual document. I have also literally kept the line breaks as present in the original document, and have placed single blank lines separating pages to fully convey the actual format of the original.

For genealogists of the Russell family, note that there is an important difference between this transcription and the previous one by Dr. Eggleston, which until the actual diary resurfaced, was the only known transcript. There is a footnote at the bottom of the first page that Dr. Eggleston applied to Dr. Dryden (that he was from Ireland). Actually, there is a mark by the name of Wm. Russell, and the same mark by that line at the bottom of the page. I'm confident that the line about coming from Ireland when quite young was intended to apply to William Russell (Wm. R. Hatchett's grandfather), not Dr. Dryden.

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Document written by William Russell Hackett on 01 September 1840.
